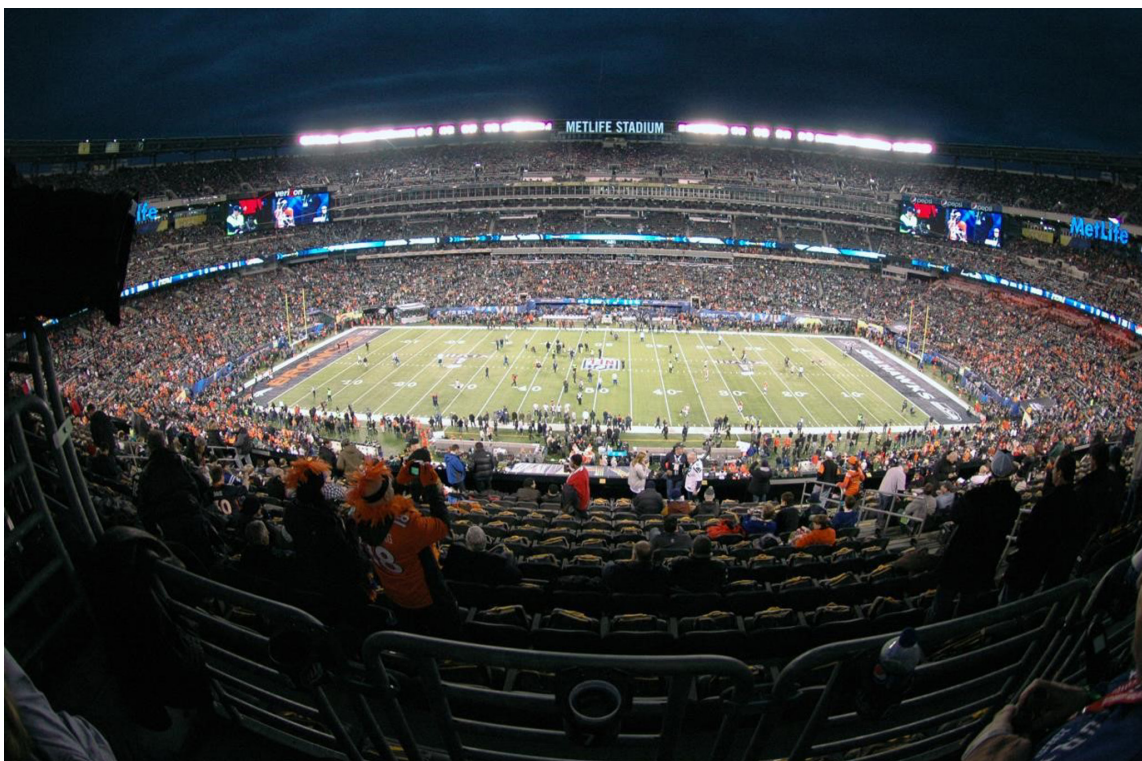

The Sport and Special Event Risk Management and Assessment Framework course brings first responders, government, and commercial facilities professionals together to develop or enhance risk assessment and management programs.
